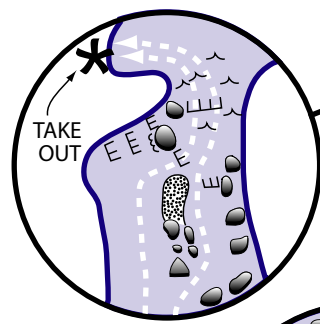


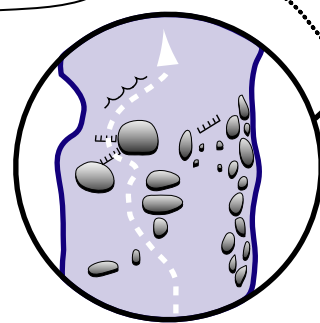
LOWER YOUGH RIVER

Paddle hard to the left immediately after these rapids.

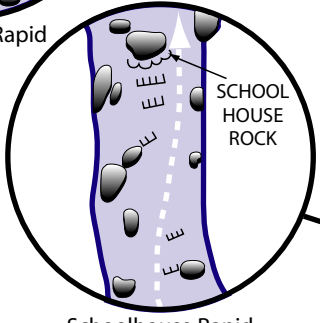


Bruner Run Rapid

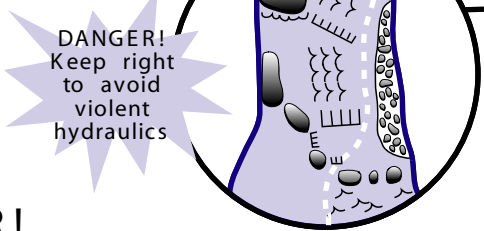

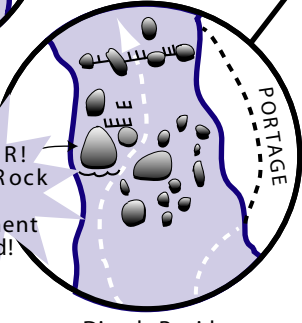


Double Hydraulics

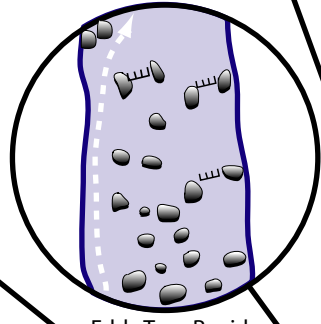


Bike Trail is the emergency exit

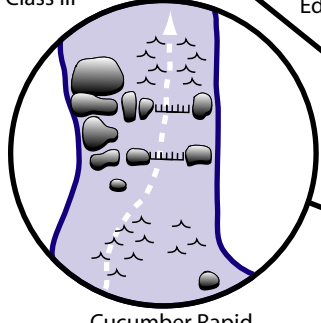

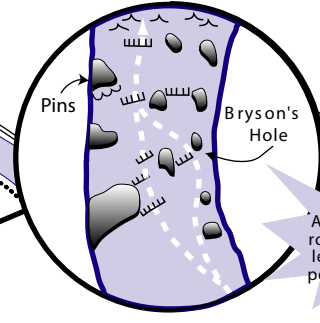
